With assistance from the 4Cs staff, a single mother of three was able to move her family from Shelter House into permanent housing and get the two school-aged children enrolled in a local school.

4Cs Home Ties worked with two foster children to provide quality child care and secure resources for their developmental and speech delays. We provided a vital base of stability for the children when they moved from one foster family to another and then finally transitioned back into their own home.

And as always, 4Cs Home Ties Child Care Center continues to provide parents the opportunity to work on their family needs while the children are safe.

One of the fundamental services that 4Cs Home Ties provides is an initial assessment of where a child is in his/her growth and development and finds ways to help them gain self-confidence and appreciate the joy of learning.
